



ST PETER AND ST PAUL'S **CHURCH**



Reflecting back on the Easter period and our Annual meeting (APCM), I have been really encouraged by the life of the church and the many people we see on a regular or infrequent basis.

Our range of services is deliberately wide; after all we are a village church. In city or suburban areas churches may choose to worship in only one way, knowing that if local people don't like it there is always another church down the road that might suit them better. In Ewhurst we deliberately set out to be a church where just about everyone can find a home; the only requirement is a willingness to engage with the Christian faith – we can work together from there. So you will find in our church a service of Holy Communion every week using the traditional language of the Book of Common Prayer, our 20/20 children's service with puppets takes place once a month, as does our children's 'breakfast service' (ends with Bacon Sandwiches - can't go wrong!). There are 2 main Holy Communion services in Anglican style and a 'morning prayer' service; we have an evensong each month and a more informal service in the Wilson Room. All this alongside the celebrations of major festivals like Easter, Harvest, Christmas and of course the Remembrance Service. In addition we heard at the APCM about the many different ways we engage with our village life and wider.

I realise that people's lives in this modern age are so much busier than in the past and we may not see them every week, but it is good that so many people feel that St Peter & St Paul's is their church - and many people contribute to the costs of keeping the church in the village.

The church these days is often seen as lacking relevance to modern life - indeed there are some people in the media who use their popularity as a platform to mock or attack any form of faith in God, and the church in particular. However my experience is that many people have a sense of God, even if church is not the first place they would come to express it.

The Church of England has spent much time and energy recently battling over issues like homosexuality and the role of







Windmill Inn for porter with which to curl her black hair. Her initials *M.L.W. 1839* are carved over the door of the mill. Mary White died in 1843 and ownership of the mill returned to the Lassam family, who continued to own it until around 1853 when it was sold to Henry Drummond, the Duke of Northumberland, of Albury Park. In the early 20<sup>th</sup> century he sold the windmill to Sir Reginald Bray of Shere who was said to have cleared trees so that it would be visible from his home in Shere. Shortly after Sir Reginald sold the mill together with part of the Warren, to Stopford Brooke who built The Four Winds. Mill Cottage remained part of the Duke of Northumberland's Albury Estate and Caleb Coldman, the last miller to have worked the mill, continued to live there after the mill ceased working. The 1901 census shows his occupation as a cordwainer (shoemaker).

#### LOCAL HISTORY CORNER by Janet Balchin

The Old Windmill on the hill above the Windmill Inn is the highest mill in the south of England. Standing at 250m above sea level it was once a conspicuous landmark, as until the mid 20<sup>th</sup> century the Surrey Hills were open heath, but is now almost completely hidden from view by trees.

Windmills fall into two broad types, according to how the sails are set to the wind. Post mills were simple structures where the entire mill revolved around a central post. Tower mills were more substantial brick buildings with the sails (or sweeps as they were often called in Surrey) attached to a revolving cap. The present mill is a tower mill, dating from the early 19<sup>th</sup> century. It replaced an older post mill, which was said to have been destroyed in a gale. It ceased working in 1885 and lay derelict for many years before being restored as a summer residence in the early years of the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

Ewhurst Mill was also known as Cranleigh Upper Mill, as it was in Cranleigh parish and Cranleigh Mill stood on the Common.

There has been a mill on this site since at least 1702 when it was mentioned in a will of William Diddlesfold. Because of its prominent position the mill was marked on most county maps produced in the 18<sup>th</sup> century, by cartographers such as John Seller in 1733, Emanuel Bowen in 1749 and John Roque in 1769. The mill was also said to be used as a rendezvous point by smugglers who used the hidden paths through The Weald and The Hurtwood to take contraband from the coast at Shoreham to their London markets.

The mill, together with Mill Cottage, was originally part of a larger estate, referred to in old deeds and manorial records as Seymes als Eymes. It extended as far south as Rapsley and was owned in 1538 by Richard Tyknor and previous to that had been owned by Sir Edward Bray. This area is called The Combe in the Cranleigh Tithe Award and Mill Cottage is called Combs in the 1851 census. From 1607 the estate belonged to the Diddlesfold family of Albury. In the first half of the 18<sup>th</sup> century it was owned by the Gardner family and after the death of John Gardener his descendents sold it to William Lassam. After the death of Jacob Lassam, the mill passed to Mary Ransley and then to Mary White, who is shown as living at Mill Cottage in the 1842 Tithe Award. A local storey told that Mary White had a pretty daughter, Mary Leah, who was said to ride about The Hurtwood on a white pony and send down to The

From their offices in Covent Garden, Cassidy, Farrington & Dennys began a long and successful business which gained them a world-wide reputation. The Rank Organization used the agency for which Yvonne worked and it was this link which resulted in the partnership gaining considerable work with them. At a time when cinemas were being lost to Bingo halls and supermarkets, a series of multi-screen cinema complexes were opening in the major cities and Nigel was the interior designer for a number of these, including the Odeon, Leicester Square. Later, at the request of a Maltese entrepreneur, the partnership designed an international hotel for him in Malta and this led to a relationship which resulted in hotels being designed and built in countries around the world for the Corinthia Group.

After retirement, remarkably, he continued until eighteen months ago in a consulting role, his last job being the interior design for the newly refurbished Corinthia Hotel, Whitehall Place. A quote from the hotel brochure — "With inspiration from world-class designers, we have created vast lobbies and high ceilings to take full advantage of spectacular cityscape views and have blended them with cutting-edge design to create iconic public spaces flooded with natural light." Working four days a week he would stay in his office on alternate nights to reduce the travelling. In addition, his designing and building continued at home and I toured his barn conversion, a fantastic facility for entertainment, and his workshop, formerly a triple garage, which has an amazing array of woodworking equipment. And above the workshop, Yvonne has a studio for her artistic work. It is here that they have both designed and made those things which have been so useful and admired around the village.

It is no surprise that both their children have followed artistic careers. Their son is a sculptor making privately commissioned pieces and some interesting sculptures in the garden at Rapsley are testament to his work. Their daughter, the arts editor for the Index magazine, has spent time recently in Burma working on the Freedom of Expression exhibition. Soon after arriving in Ewhurst, Nigel was elected chairman of the Parish Council and he continues today as one of the governors of Sayers Croft Rural Centre and as a member of the editorial board of the Village Society. We are certainly indebted to his expertise and involvement over the years.

#### Why the Parish Church has a Gift Day

You will have received a leaflet about the Parish Church Gift Day in this magazine. The £55,367.00 required this year to maintain a church ministry in Ewhurst, is donated by just 152 people.

However, after that is paid, the church **still** has to find the money to pay for all the running costs such as, utility bills, church and churchyard maintenance, stationery, music and office expenses. These are the costs we are **unable** to fully cover and why we ask the village for help. This year, we again have a deficit of just over £24,000. This is similar to last year but then, with your generosity on the Gift Day, our Fund Raising events which you supported and careful management, we reduced this to just over £2000.00 in 2012.

We hope that you will be as generous and supportive again this year on June 29th.

We have still had to resort to the undesirable measure of drawing on church reserves to cover running costs. This can only go on for another two or three years before our reserves run out. After that, we could lose our own Rector and **not** get anyone in his place. The people in the Church feel very strongly that they do not want this to happen. But without more money coming in, it could. Losing our own Rector could also impact on this community as the church becomes less able to deliver what Ewhurst expects of it.

Please be aware of this when it comes to our Gift Day and also perhaps consider making a regular monthly donation towards the running of our lovely church.

#### In Our Midst ~ Nigel Farrington

#### **Architect to a Village**

Over the years Ewhurst has benefited from the many professional people who have moved to the village and given their services to the community. None more so than Nigel who, as a professional architect, has designed three of our recent buildings, the Bowls Clubhouse, the EYSC building and the Wilson Room in the churchyard. Not forgetting the



community notice board opposite the village shop - most important of all, he says.

Nigel and Yvonne came to Ewhurst in 1977, when, together with a close army friend, they moved to the late sixteenth century farmhouse known as Rapsley. They took the Victorian extension where they still live, while his friend occupied the grade II listed farmhouse itself. Nigel's brother also moved to the cottage next door making what Nigel called at the time, a "Middle Aged Commune". There were still large piles of earth over the grounds where, a few years earlier it had been the scene of an archaeological dig by Rosamond Hanworth who had re-excavated the fourth century Romano-British villa previously worked by the Victorians. Now it is cleared and levelled and still visited occasionally by interested historians.

Nigel was born and brought up between the wars, in Sutton Valence, not far from Maidstone. Finishing school at Sutton Valence towards the end of the war and needing to do National Service, he took a place on a short engineering course at university in Belfast. This led to entry into the Royal Engineers and he was sent to Ripon for training, then to Poona, India where he spent three years with the Royal Bombay Sappers and Miners training the local people in engineering skills. After demob back in Ripon, he completed the final four years of the five year course at the Architectural Association School of Architecture in Bedford Square, London. The firm of architects teaching at the School, gave him his first position but he also undertook contracts of his own working in the evenings. This quite quickly led to the formation of a partnership with fellow ex-students Cassidy and Dennys.

#### Blooming, marvellously!



Those of you who are keen gardeners will know the thrill of the reward of months, even years of labour coming to fruition. As I write this in May, the flowering of my small group of Florist Auriculas is giving me great joy and pleasure. Since being small I have been acquainted with the 'Dusty Miller' Auricula, which grew in our rockery persistently, but every year required tucking back into the earth after

flowering as new offsets grew. It must have been Autumn when my Mum did this as my memory of her is wearing her warm gardening coat kneeling to do this task. Although that is no guarantee as the north-easterly wind blows most of the time in South Northumberland.

This hardy yellow primula auricula with dusty leaves originates in the Alpine regions and is recorded in English gardens in the 18<sup>th</sup> Century and fell out of fashion, probably because a vast variety of different and colourful plants were being bred, including the Border Auriculas which have no farina (dust) and also the more difficult to grow, 'Show' and 'Florist' varieties.

However the history of auriculas reaches further back into the history of Europe and the people who cultivated flowering plants and brought plants with them when they migrated to England. First were the Flemish wool weavers who settled initially in northern towns, Norwich, Ipswich, Rochdale in the late 16<sup>th</sup> Century and moved to the northern mills with the industrial revolution. In the 17<sup>th</sup> Century the Huguenot refugees fled from France to England settling in Spitalfields and weaving silk material. All brought their precious auricula plants with them. Their long hours working at the looms were balanced by the relaxation of tending their plants and eventually gave rise to the wonderful and varied collections of blooms we have today.

#### **News from Ewhurst CE Infant School**

The reason for the migration or flight, particularly by the Huguenots, was their faith. They were protestant and took sanctuary in 17th Century England from the persecutions in France. Sadly it is so often persecution that causes migration to a distant land. It was persecution in 70AD when the Temple in Jerusalem was destroyed that caused the diaspora of the Christian community across the known world then. They travelled the trade routes to Turkey, Greece, Egypt, around the Mediterranean to France, Spain, England and Ireland taking with them their faith, the gift which had been given to them by God in Jesus Christ which they shared with the communities in which they settled and lived.

Having been captivated by the auricular flowers for many years, but with little success, I have discovered the right conditions for growing them by serendipity. I was forced to resite my small greenhouse to what seemed an unlikely spot, shady and cold with just a couple of hours of sunlight at midday. They have taken to the new site with generosity, and are blooming. Auriculas are Alpines and do not need cosseting, except that they will not tolerate being wet.

I mentioned that the old Dusty Miller grew out of the soil and needed tucking back in each year. This is the habit of these plants, they set new offshoots which in the natural state put down roots and travel across the ground. Grown in pots the offshoots must be removed and potted up annually, and of course the original plant carries on.

The Primula Auricula has travelled in habit, history and development and is linked also to our particular Christian heritage here in England. Both plant and faith have bloomed marvellously over the years.

#### **Ewhurst Baptist Church**

Having just returned from the Parish Council AGM yesterday evening, where we were treated to a number of short presentations from various organisations and clubs in Ewhurst. This set me musing on the nature of communities and voluntary service that operate within them. The presentations of Ewcare and LEAP particularly, showed me that within Ewhurst we have many who care enough for others and the environment to express it in their own voluntary service for the benefit of others.

Life for all of us tends to follow cycles and rhythms, times when things are good and times when the going is hard. This is often, though not always, associated with our age and I suppose the rhythm of the seasons remind us that the clock continues to tick, the days and the seasons pass us by. This sense of rhythm that is present within all our lives is expressed in the Bible through this beautiful but ancient piece of poetry:

There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven: a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot, a time to kill and a time to heal, a time to tear down and a time to build, a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance, a time to scatter stones and a time to gather them, a time to embrace and a time to refrain,

a time to search and a time to give up, a time to keep and a time to throw away,

a time to tear and a time to mend, a time to be silent and a time to speak, a time to love and a time to hate, a time for war and a time for peace.

I personally find it helpful to reflect on this sense of rhythm and balance as in our modern society we are often too quick to simply focus on the aspects of life that personally suit us and dismiss those other dimensions of life that though initially less attractive, help keep our whole life in proportion and perspective.

The Bible along with the writings of other faith traditions contains much wisdom literature. Literature from our ancestors that tries to help us appreciate life in all its complexity and diversity, so that we might more fully engage with it, living lives that are of value. I would suggest that our value in life is really only seen through the eyes of others. Valuing ourselves in isolation has limited worth, it is only in our

relationships, our giving to and receiving from others that we find our own identity and fullness in life.

The Burial Ground has suffered badly during the heavy rains of the last year with flooding causing a lot of distress to relatives visiting the graves. The Parish Council has dug a drainage ditch to the left of the right of the Lych Gate to try to alleviate the area worst affected. Historically the Burial Ground has always suffered from bogginess but of course unprecedented amounts of rain over the last year summer and winter have highlighted this fact. It would be nice to deal more effectively with the problem in the near future but unfortunately this year's cut backs and increase in energy prices has reduced available funds for such projects. We can only hope for a dryer period now to improve the area. The vastly over grown hedge running either side of the Lych Gate has been cut back to improve the light to the area which should help with the drying out should we be fortunate enough to have better weather. Some of the fence along the East of the Burial Ground has been renewed.

The Parish Council has received details of 'Project Horizon' the County Council's planned maintenance schedule over the next five years of Roads around Ewhurst and Ellen's Green. This Project plans to get our roads up to scratch over this period and incorporates both remedial and major works to our Roads. The County Council have apologised for the fiasco of road closures along the Shere Road in March which caused a lot of extra mileage for those travelling that way for a period which greatly exceeded the length of time it took to carry out the work. They have mentioned that they have learned lessons and these lessons will hopefully serve them well with the forthcoming planned works of the 'Project Horizon'.

Many households have expressed alarm at the idea of being virtually imprisoned in their homes during the course of the planned cycling races over the summer. The Parish Council have lobbied strenuously for these events to be reconsidered and will continue to do so.

You may have seen the Embroidered Jubilee Panel framed and resplendent in the village hall. Funded partly by the Parish Council this has been photographed and made into a card for the Queen's Coronation Jubilee this year and will be sent to her. A copy of the card is was on display in the village hall during the Parish Council's Annual Parish Meeting. The Annual Parish meeting was well attended this year and the speakers from LEAP, Ewcare, Rainbows End, The Old Rectory and The Stool Ball Club were very entertaining and interesting.

## News from Ewhurst Parish Council



Many of you will have sampled first-hand the fund raising efforts of The Parish Council's Playground Committee in the shape of the fashion show held in March. This event started our fundraising off to a flying start and raised over £1500 towards Phase Two of the Village Playground Project. This Phase aims to raise sufficient funds to replace the old part of the Playground with new exciting equipment together with an all-weather wet pour surface. The Playground is inspected annually and wear and tear to the equipment together with weather damage will necessitate its replacement in the next few years and we aim to be ready with our funding before that occurs. We have also received donations from organisations and individuals within the village to whom we are very grateful. The Parish Council has applied for a grant from Surrey County Council's Community Investment Levy Fund. We are doubtful that we will receive funding from this source this year despite our application being fully supported by Surrey County Councillor Alan Young as we have heard the fund has been oversubscribed.

The Playground Committee, no sooner had they finished one event, started to plan the second event in the form of a lunch time party for the children of the village. This event whilst in aid of fund raising for the Playground has an emphasis of providing a fun entertainment event for the children in the grounds of The Old Rectory. The ticket price will include a lunch and entertainment although there will also be various other distractions available as well. The third event planned by the Committee is a pub quiz to be held at the Bull's Head details of which will shortly be published.




