One of the great joys of living in Ewhurst comes from it being a village with a strong sense of its own identity. Clubs and societies abound, we have a thriving pub, school and nursery, village shop as well as a number of other small businesses tucked away, good sports and recreation facilities, things for children and families to do, and the churches, both Parish and Baptist are loved and supported.

I have a very clear sense of calling as Priest to this community. True enough part of my job involves working for the Diocese outside the Parish, but in the main I believe the role of the village church lies within its community. And that means providing opportunities that, within reason, allow everyone who wishes to worship God to do so in a way which is meaningful and relevant to them.

I think one of the strengths of our Parish church lies in the varied pattern of worship we are able to offer. The ministry team of Tim, Tricia, John and myself allows us to provide a range of worship opportunities, from the beauty and quiet of 8am Book of Common Prayer Communion, through regular Church of England liturgical services, to our children and family based services, 20/20 and the 9.15 Breakfast service. Val and the choir provide the music to lovely choral services as well as those big church and village occasions like Harvest, Remembrance, Christmas and Easter. I know that the Baptist church brings its own ways of approaching God in worship.

This year, by way of encouraging that variety of worship, I was able to take 6 members of the 20/20 puppet team away to the 'European Puppet Ministry Convention' in Rugby. There – I bet you never knew there was such a thing did you!

We had a fabulous and fascinating time with more than 400 other puppeteers from churches across the country and abroad. Workshops and seminars on all aspects of All Age worship, competitions which saw rival puppet teams pit themselves against each other in all manner of puppet techniques; solo, skit, song, vent, blacklight – what a display of talent, and an opportunity to learn from others and be inspired. Professionals showed off their talents and held seminars discussing choreography, scenery and costume, ventriloquism, storytelling, conjuring and illusion as well as teaching advanced techniques and modern technology.

Our 20/20 service has been running for 8 years on the first Sunday of the month at 10.30am. I know it is not everybody's cup of tea, but it isn't aimed at everybody. It has a loyal following among mostly young families, where they know the children will hear and engage with Bible stories in ways that they will enjoy and that will capture their imagination. It's not just the young either; many older people find that the sense of fun, creativity and joy that comes from 20/20 enhances their own worship.

I think it's a shame that many people who have faith don't go to church because in the past they have found the whole experience dry and unwelcoming; worse, it has failed to make connections to God that have been relevant to their lives or situation. I'm sorry that has happened and I'm determined that anyone who has a sense of God, however strong or tiny, should find a setting in church where they can worship, learn and explore their understanding of God.

Please come and join us, especially as we move into the Christmas season – I assure you that you will find meaningful ways of expressing the joy of Christ in the world.

THE BISHOP OF GUILDFORD has met with the Primate of all Nigeria, The Most Revd Nicholas Okoh, as the Diocese of link with the Church of Nigeria prepares to turn 50 next year.



The Rt Revd Christopher Hill, who retires in December, also conveyed personal greetings from the Archbishop of Canterbury, Dr Justin Welby, as a team from Guildford received a warm welcome in Abuja.

Archbishop Nicholas heard reports of the recent visit to Guildford of Archdeacon John Adubasim, of Niger Delta North, and expressed personal thanks to parishes for the Diocesan-wide call to prayer in Guildford during the abduction of Archbishop Ignatius Kattay in September, happily resolved a week later.

The two Bishops affirmed their commitment to mutual learning between Nigeria and Guildford, and to continue strengthening ties born out of the Anglican Conference in Toronto in 1963 - the oldest link of its kind in the Anglican Communion.

The Bishop of Guildford, The Rt Revd Christopher Hill said: "I am very glad to have met with Archbishop Nicholas, and am grateful for his kind hospitality.

"His passion for the gospel is pre-eminent; as also is his deep respect and affection for the Church of England which sent the first missionaries to Nigeria.

"While we do not hide the fact that there are challenges ahead for this relationship, the affirmation given and commitment to mutual prayer is a source of genuine encouragement.

"We have much to learn from one other, and our Christian witness is the richer for continued companionship and understanding with brothers and sisters across such diverse cultural contexts."

Joan Miller – ‘one year + on’ – formerly of Old Trees

I thought I would update her many friends from Ewhurst on her situation one year ‘plus’ on after her move from Old Trees up to Wycliffe, North Yorkshire.

My latest trip to see my Mother was at the end of September (just before her 96th birthday). Her eyesight (macular degeneration) is definitely getting worse and it is causing her some upset that she cannot see things pointed out to her both in the country and in the garden (which you know she adored). As regards her Alzheimer’s, this is getting gradually worse but we knew this would happen. Again it upsets her that she cannot remember anything that has recently occurred but, talk to her about the past, and she is fine. Bailey is calming down and enjoys his runs in their very large garden with Keith’s three other dogs (dalmation and two spaniels).

Her carers are doing admirable work with her and, of course, with Keith’s mother-in-law who also lives in the annexe to Keith and Patricia’s house. Two of the Carers were part of the group that were at Ewhurst and another one has been brought in on the rota so they all do about 4 – 6 weeks at a time. The carer takes both ladies out as much as possible and Joan and Isabel (Patricia’s mother who used to live up in Middlesbrough) also go to the Sunday morning service with Keith and Patricia to whatever village the Service is being held that week. She obviously is not able to go to as many coffee mornings, “winter lunches” etc as she did when at Ewhurst but, on the other hand, Joan and Isabel are company for one another and they both feel they are “looking after the other one”. Keith spends as much time with her in his garden when his work and weather permits and she does enjoy pottering around with him. When I was up there, Keith and mother were collecting plums from their trees and as quickly as I could get them indoors, Isabel and I were stoning them ready for Patricia to make the jam – a joint effort. But as you can see she is quite sprightly considering her age and knee problems.

Both Keith and I are very grateful to the number of people that have been in contact with her either by phone or in correspondence. The problem is she cannot hear people on the phone very well so conversations are obviously very short

and one-sided! She can read correspondence in large writing or print but, with her macular degeneration, her handwriting has become very small indeed so if she writes a note of reply it is almost impossible for the recipient to read.

We hope friends will continue to keep in touch with her from time to time, preferably by letter, and will appreciate that she is not able to reply that often as explained above. If anyone wants to contact me for more frequent info please feel free to do so.

Young and old we journey together

As I write this in November I am very aware of the turning of the season as we have been rushed through Autumn by gales sweeping away the glorious coloured leaves with their memories of long summer days.

So we begin the new Church year on Advent Sunday with Holy Communion and 20/20 Services when our Nativity figures, Mary, Joseph and the donkey begin their journey around homes in the Village community where each family offers hospitality to one another and the figures. Young and old, we will count off the 24 days until Christmas Eve with our figures and Calendars and chocolate stars, each one telling part of the story once again of God's revelation in the world as Jesus; God in humanity, born in the same way as each of us and living among us.

Our Christingle and Carol services will also tell of the Son of God coming among us. This is the story of Creation, the miracle of new life in each birth.

At Christmas time we remember that we come together to give thanks for the gift of Jesus. This is a joyful gift which must be shared with others, with 'outsiders' and people who are not 'family' and so we take our faith with us into the world and in January, at Epiphany, we remember the Wise Men who came to worship and went back to their distant land, taking news of the birth of Jesus with them.

Sadly Christmas is not a happy time for everyone and it can be a time of poignancy if there is an empty chair at our table. Also there are many families that are troubled and children who are in need.

This year we have helped to pioneer the Real Advent Calendar made by the Meaningful Chocolate Company, a Fairtrade company, and containing a small booklet telling the Christmas Story. A donation is made from the sale of each calendar to the Children's Society that also revived the lovely Christingle Service as a way of spreading the Light of Christ.

The Children's Society was originally established to take children into care and for adoption. They have latterly moved on from this to help children in crisis situations, and they are a children's charity who help children of all faiths and none, including children at risk on the streets, disabled children, young refugees, young carers or those within the youth justice system. Through lobbying and research, they seek to influence child protection policy and perceptions at all levels so that young people have a better chance in life. Their website is www.childrenssociety.org.uk. The work they do is very positive in helping children who are very much in need and it is an example of how we can express the practical living out of our faith in the world.

The season of Epiphany ends with Candlemas on February 2nd, when we remember how Mary and Joseph took Jesus into the Temple and how Simeon and Anna, the elderly prophets there, recognised Jesus as the long awaited Messiah (Luke 2:36 -40). Both Simeon and Anna kept the faith throughout their lives and with the insight and wisdom which old age can bring, both were granted the fulfilment of their hopes.

We often fail to notice the important presence of the elderly in the Nativity account; the Wise Men, probably Zoroastrian Astronomers from Persia, and Simeon and Anna, faithful believers in God's promises.

Young and old we journey together in community and family as the weeks roll onward and we can look forward to the Candlemas bells, the Snowdrops, in February.

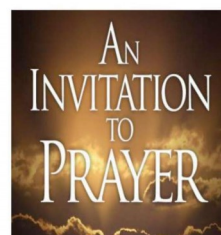
Knowing that prayer changes things, we meet on the fourth Thursday evening of every month at the Baptist Church in order to pray for the village of Ewhurst.

News from Ewhurst Parish Council



The Playground Committee chaired by Councillor Victoria Helstrip is very pleased to announce that they are in receipt of a grant for £40,000 from the Surrey County Council Community Investment Fund. They have received funds from other awards and from the fundraising of the Playground Committee. The Parish Council are now only a short way from reaching their target, £82,000, for the phase two renewal of the Village Playground.

Councillor Victoria Helstrip is discussing plans for the commemoration of the Centenary of the First World War in late 2014. The Council plan to give the Village War Memorial a facelift and to help organise a special ceremony. Victoria would like to hear from any relatives of those commemorated on the war memorial. It would make the occasion very special indeed if members of those soldiers families could be represented at the ceremony. Councillor Tim Bloomfield has continued to try to improve the safety of the crossing to the school. The hazard lights are now once again working and Surrey County Council are looking at further plans to slow traffic down near the crossing. There is to be a meeting shortly between Surrey County Council, the Parish Council and the school to discuss putting the operation of the lights into the hands of the school rather than being centrally controlled.

Councillor Tim Bloomfield also represents the Parish Council at the Surrey County Council Highways Task Group meetings where issues of concern on the highways are brought up and prioritised for action. A list of four has been agreed upon by the Parish Council for the forthcoming meeting being: the School Crossing; the Coneyhurst/Shere Road junction; deterrence of large vehicles along the Shere Road by better signage; and Horsham Road speed limit reduction from 50mph to 40mph.

Councillor Julie Francis has been keeping an eye on crime developments in the Parish and a series of shed and out house burglaries has prompted the e-bulletin describing ways to make your garden more secure from crime. The e-bulletin is sent out regularly as a way of sending out messages from the Parish Council concerning the community to the local community. Councillor Chris Lyth has headed a debate at a recent Parish Council meeting concerning road closures in Ewhurst and Ellen's Green. He felt something should be said following the deluge of complaints received from residents with stories of financial loss and severe inconvenience as caused by these closures. The outcome of the debate was that the Par-

from residents with stories of financial loss and severe inconvenience as caused by these closures. The outcome of the debate was that the Parish Council should write to Waverley Borough Council and Surrey County Council pointing out the issues raised. The Parish Council called for prior consultation directly with the Parish Council well before any road closure; if indeed road closures were to go ahead; then to have better control measures in place; and finally to facilitate financial compensation for businesses that have suffered financial loss due to the road closure. Surrey County Council has responded by carrying out a consultation on Surrey Cycling Strategy and information on this can be found on the Surrey County Council website . There was no support from Surrey County Council for financial compensation for businesses.

The Parish Council also received much correspondence on the proposed footpath diversion around Widewoods and the Parish Council has objected to this on behalf of the residents. There were very many valid points raised by local individuals using the path and Councillor Chris Lyth summarised these and under direction from the Parish Council wrote to Surrey County Council Countryside Access. We are expecting a decision imminently.

The building of the Ewhurst Youth and Sports Centre has left the Parish Council indebted to the Football Foundation who supplied a large amount of funding to build the property and improve the football pitches. As a result of this funding the Parish Council and Football Clubs are monitored by the Football Foundation. We meet annually with representatives of the FF and supply amongst other information, data of football club membership and financial details. Following the recent review it has been decided that the Parish Council and football clubs need to meet regularly to discuss issues such as football pitch, maintenance funding and EYSC hire charges. This to ensure the Football Foundation are happy that all parties are working together and thus enabling the criteria laid down by the Football Foundation to be met. This involves a lot of voluntary time given by the leaders of the football clubs and the Chair of Ewhurst Parish Council; however it is thought worthwhile to be able to offer local residents such a wonderful facility in the recreation ground. By the time you read this then you will have received and hopefully completed the Affordable Housing Survey commissioned by the Parish Council in partnership with Surrey Community Action to establish *your* views on the matter of providing *affordable* housing in Ewhurst and Ellen's Green. The data collected in the survey will be analysed by Surrey Community Action and subsequently the results will be reported

**In Our Midst Cecil Muggeridge
The One and Only**

Everyone knows Cecil. Whether he is cycling to his next project on the roadside or just standing outside his farm gate, he has always got time for a chat and to catch up with the latest news. When I caught up with him he was recovering from a broken hip after coming off second best to one of his heifers. We sat in front of his new log burner, tended by his son Robert and surrounded by his many pictures, newly hung after last year's tragic house fire.



Cecil remembers stories told to him years ago detailing the life and times of his family who were farming here well before he was born. Stories retold with clarity and detail which build a fascinating picture of the way of life dating back to mid-Victorian times. You won't have room for it all he says, and he's right.

In 1894, his grandmother and her brother Bill took the joint tenancy of Hillhouse Farm in Somersbury Lane, at that time the most southerly part of the Abinger estate. His grandmother was Fanny Hamshire, daughter of Eli Hamshire of Ewhurst Green, known for his tract "Three Acres and a Cow". In 1900 she married local farmer Moses Muggeridge in a joint wedding in Ewhurst church with brother Bill marrying in the same ceremony. They took the tenancy of Stringers Hand Farm near the Chequers pub at Rowhook while Bill remained at Hillhouse. It was at Rowhook that Cecil's mother was born. Farming in those days was very hard with no electricity, gas or mains water and only horses to work the land. In 1905, the summer was hot and dry and the wells and ground water dried up. Water for the animals had to be fetched by horse and cart from a stream at the bottom of Rowhook Hill. During the first war, farms were expected to produce more edible crops and so the family returned to Hillhouse Farm to help work it with brother Bill and his family.

In 1920, Lord Abinger died and the family was able to buy the freehold to the farm. Like all the local farms, a living was made making hay, growing crops for animal feed and selling eggs and home-made butter locally. It was a difficult time necessitating long hours of hard work to keep up the payments on the mortgage and the arrival of a mains water supply in 1922 made everything easier. Now a milking herd could be built up and milk could be sold by licence farther afield in Cranleigh and taken by train to Guildford and beyond. Furthermore, in 1932 the creation of the Milk Marketing Board was the saviour of many a small farm as it

and taken by train to Guildford and beyond. Furthermore, in 1932 the creation of the Milk Marketing Board was the saviour of many a small farm as it guaranteed a market for as much as anyone could produce. It was also collected directly from the farms.

Born at Hillhouse Farm, Cecil went from there to the village school at Ellen's Green. He remembers how strict the schoolmistress was and many of the children were taken away, preferring to go to the easier Wallis Wood School instead. He left school at the end of the second war and helped the family on the farm growing kale, mangels and swede for cattle feed. Harvesting these crops in the fields in the freezing cold winter weather was particularly hard work. He worked the land with the last remaining cart horse in the area and regularly lead the young heifers along the road to a farm near Baynards Station to be serviced by the bull. They would be left there overnight and collected again next day. It was more successful than the modern A.I. he reckons.

Cecil loved old time dancing. As a young man, he learned to dance at the youth club in Rudgwick, run at Maybanks by a Mrs Cecil who rented a barn there. Dances, with a three or four piece band, were held in the different villages in turn, Ellens Green, Oakwood Hill, Cranleigh. Cecil would go to them all. They were very successful and kept going until the early sixties – until the Beatles started the rot he says.

He met Bonnie at Benson's Fair in Cranleigh, a local girl whose grandfather had been a charcoal burner in Somersbury Woods, and in 1956 they were married. In 1957 they moved to Parliament Farm where he still lives today. The family had been working this farm since 1937 and Cecil had been cycling from Hillhouse every day to tend the heifers he kept there. Now he continued with the heifers but drove back from there to Hillhouse every day to work while Bonnie raised their three children at home. He continued to do this until his mother died at Hillhouse and the farm was finally sold.

Nowadays Cecil has had to slow down but he still helps Robert with their herd of shorthorn crosses, nine at present. They certainly made a good show a few years ago when Cecil was interviewed about them on the local TV programme "Country Ways". And he still keeps the hedges clear. Just before his accident and while the Cranleigh Road was closed he took the opportunity to clear back all the overhanging branches from Ewhurst to the cottages at Bookhurst. Not one to be tied at home for long, he is already talking about riding his bike again. Long may he continue.

LOCAL HISTORY CORNER by Janet Balchin

Christmas in Ewhurst 80 years ago

The Parish Magazine for January 1934 gives us a glimpse of what life was like in Ewhurst eighty years ago. The magazine reported that on the 21st the “*school closed for Christmastide with a very happy little concert, each class entertaining the others. The senior girls gave an original muscle farce entitled ‘The Rag Doll’ arranged by Joan Shurlock. The junior class gave us a splendid play, which we hope at some future concert to produce in public. The little ones delighted us with a Christmas play, which we have already been asked to again produce at the coming Women’s Institute Social on January 17th* [At this time the school took children to the age of 14]

There was also a school at Ellens Green. Here the children and their parents were treated to a tea and entertainment at Maybanks. “*All sat down to tables simply loaded with good things, and, needless to say, all did justice to the fare provided. After tea Mr Swithenbank [the owner of Maybanks] kindly gave a most interesting and amusing set of films, which produced lots of merriment. Then came the Rector [Re. Dollar] who made a perfect Father Christmas and presented each one with a gift from a most beautiful Christmas tree. Then, last of all, hearty cheers and thanks to Mrs. Swithenbank for her kindness....*”

The church supported various charities and cheques were sent to the Sheffield Poor Parish Fund (St. Lukes), The Waifs and Strays [now the Children’s Society], and the Parish Nurse Fund, which supported the Ewhurst district nurse, a valuable service in pre- NHS days.

The church was decorated for Christmas “*What a seasonable picture was presented to worshippers on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. The very simplicity of masses of holly and ivy created a happy atmosphere. The glorious big Christmas tree heavily laden with beautiful toys was a pleasant surprise.*” The toys were later sent to St Lukes, Sheffield and Poplar Hospital.

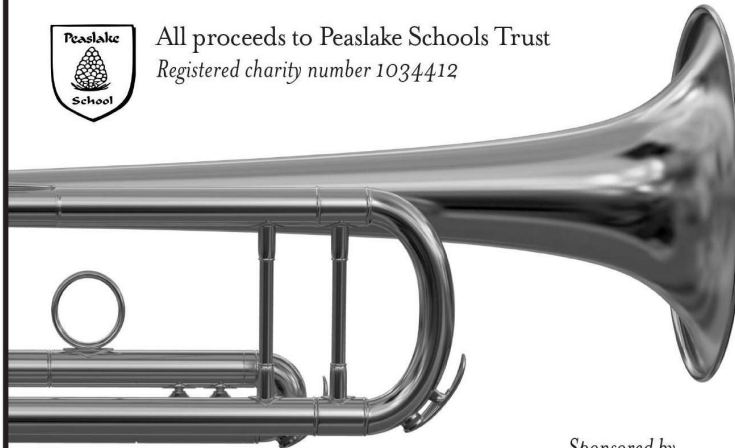

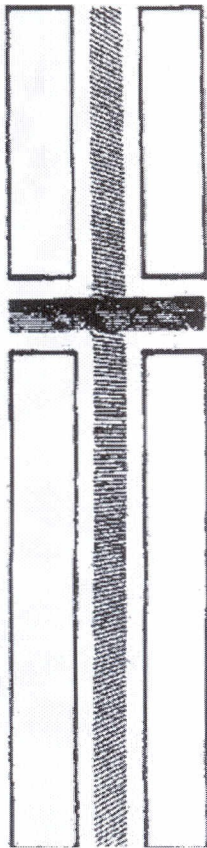
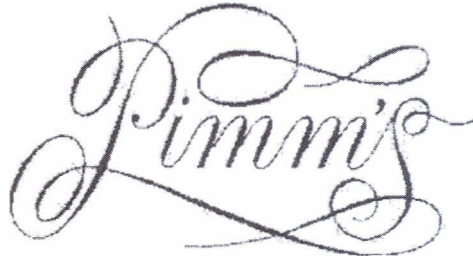
