This week I had my appraisal with the Archdeacon and it set me reflecting (that's partly the idea). The form I (and others) have to fill in asks question about my sense of calling, my spirituality, my leadership, study and communication.

Being a priest in the Church of England is surely one of the most varied jobs there could be. The Church takes people who they believe have been called by God into ministry; introvert or extrovert, 'people' people or solitary people, upfront leaders and 'stand alongside' leaders, people with all their strengths and weaknesses – in fact people made in the image of God with all the variety that assumes.

I love doing what I do and consider it a privilege. I'm also aware that I am here in a village like Ewhurst very much at the invitation of the people. The finances of the church are well known to many of you, and paying the costs of having a Rector is a significant factor. If you didn't want me here it would be an easy matter.... still, let's not go there.

But I believe, like the C of E that I am here at God's call, with a job to do serving God and this community. Much of that job is unseen and deals with people on a one to one basis, sometimes it's more upfront. I enjoy it all (except maybe admin!)

One of the aspects I enjoy most is sharing theology with people of all ages. Theology sounds a bit daunting but it is just reflection on God (Theos=God, Logos=word). People have often assumed that theology – in fact church and God himself, must be very dry and not hugely relevant to modern life. Of course I couldn't disagree more. If God exists at all (and I believe the very extraordinariness of life suggests He probably does) then surely that is the most important thing ever! From there it is a simple step to wanting to find out more, think through our faith further and simply be excited about life with our very incomplete understanding of who God is.

Communicating theology in ways that we can all relate to is my passion. I enjoy working with children in School Assemblies, All Age services like our 20/20 and Breakfast service and at Holiday Club; those things are a real fun part of my work – ‘how do I retell the stories of God to children in fresh and meaningful ways?’ But I also love to open up the Bible to adults.

So many people either embrace or dismiss faith in God without ever engaging with the conversation. The people who come to church and so at least hear some of my sermons seem to appreciate them, but I’d love to engage further with people in a conversation about God. Do you believe? Why – on what basis? Don’t believe – why not?

The Bible is a window on God – full of exciting stories, poems, history lessons and the weirdest characters!

I’d love to engage with you in reading the Bible and asking questions and I’m looking for ways of doing that better; maybe a 15 minute sermon a couple of times a month isn’t the best way!

This Autumn I will be leading Confirmation Classes. Confirmation in the Church of England is about taking on for yourself Baptism vows made for you as an infant. You don’t need to be Baptised – or know anything about theology, you may not even wish to go through with Confirmation ceremony itself (this year being held in Guildford Cathedral), but if you’d like to engage in the discussion then I’d love to hear from you – you know my number – no pressure.

Let’s not be careless about our God thinking; you’ll always be welcome in church to join our theological discussion at any level of age or understanding.

My appraisal reminded me that sharing the good news about God is why I was called to the ministry and I’d love to do that with you.

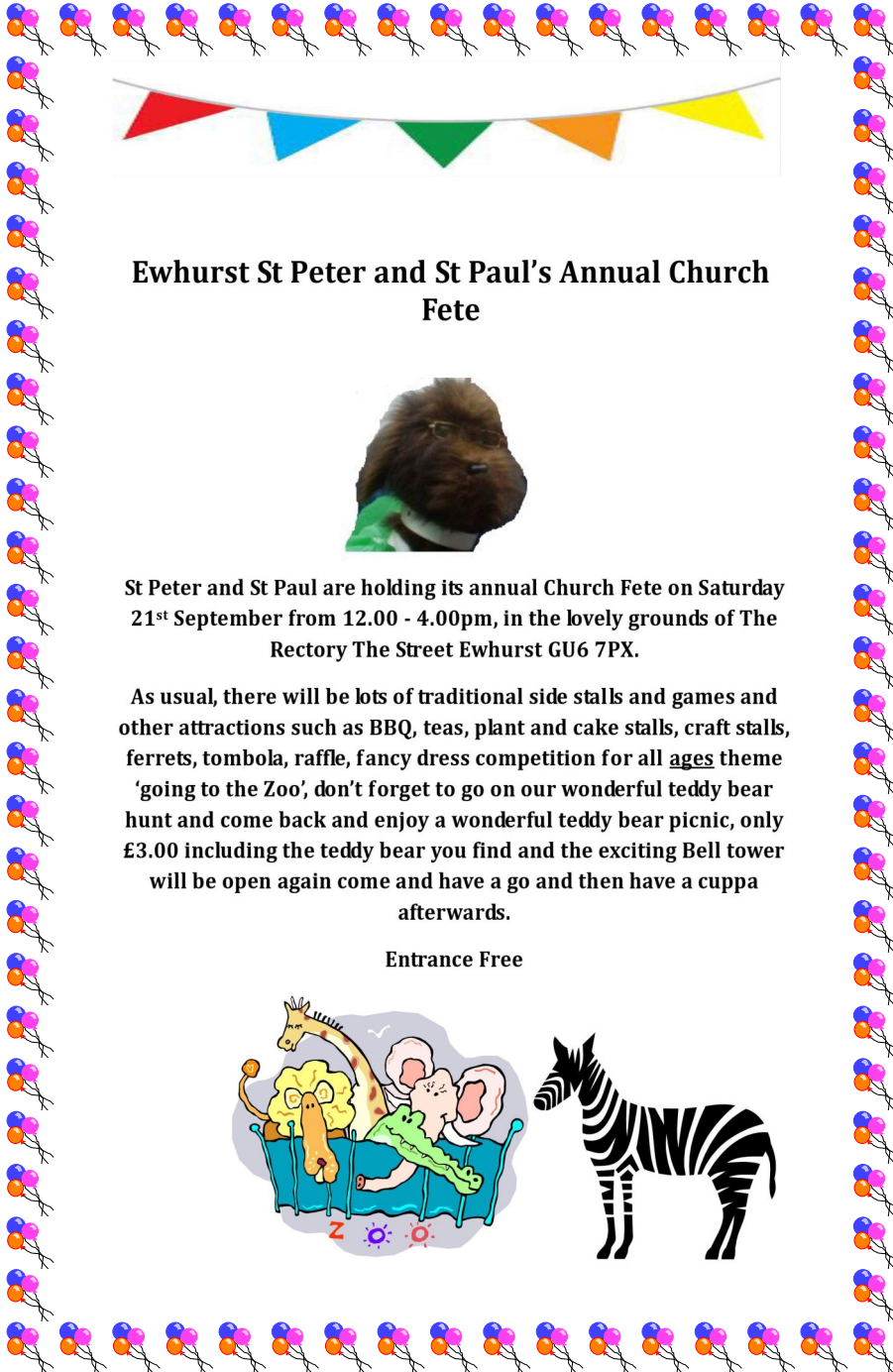

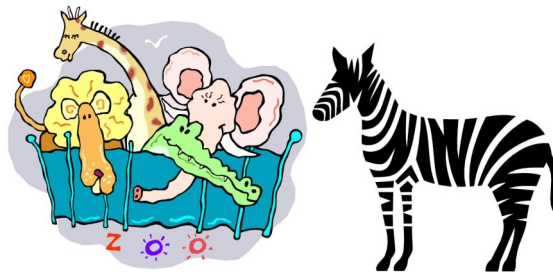
Ewhurst St Peter and St Paul's Annual Church Fete



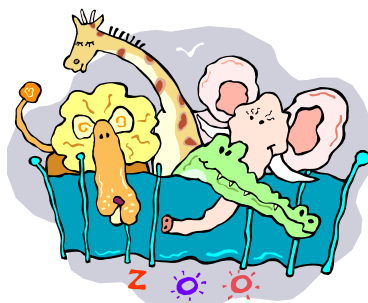

St. Francis of Assisi

I began thinking about this article during the third week in July. This happened to coincide with the annual census of the swan population on the Thames called Swan Upping. The historic ceremony dates from the 12th century, when the Crown claimed ownership of all mute swans because they were prized dishes at banquets and feasts. In the 15th century ownership of swans was shared with the Worshipful Companies of Dyers and Vintners, who thereafter participated in the ceremony. Today, although the Crown has the right to ownership of all unmarked mute swans in open water, the Queen only exercises her right on certain stretches of the Thames. Tradition is honoured during Swan Upping in the Thames rowing skiffs used and the scarlet uniforms worn by The Queen's Swan Uppers, led by the Queen's Swan Marker.

There is a serious side to the ceremony. On average, 30 swan per day are caught, weighed and measured to obtain estimates of growth rates and other information. In addition the birds are given a health check and ringed by The Queen's Swan Warden, who is the Professor of Ornithology at Oxford University. At the end of Swan Upping, the Queen's Swan Marker writes a report that includes the number of swans, broods and cygnets. This data contributes to the conservation of swans. In addition, children are given the opportunity of seeing swans and their cygnets at close quarters as well as learning about the dangers they face and the conservation measures that are being taken.



For many people, the animals they see most often are birds although they are usually rather smaller than swans. Small birds are frequently pictured together with St. Francis of Assisi (1181-1226), whose feast day is 4th October. Pictures of him often show birds perching on his hand or flying close by.

Legend has it that he would go into the woods to “preach to my sisters the birds”. Francis taught that the world was created by God to be beautiful as well as good. His message was that men and all living creatures had a duty to praise God. Also as the most intelligent of God’s creation, humans have a duty to enjoy the natural world and to protect it. There are many stories of St. Francis that demonstrate the high regard he had for animals and their environment. In a small way, the Swan Upping of today is an example of the importance we give to animals and the ceremony is evidence of our care for the environment.

St. Francis became the Patron Saint of animals and ecologists but he had an eventful life. After a chequered youth that involved early wealth, a period as a soldier and captivity, he had a serious illness that caused a spiritual crisis. He asked God for enlightenment and afterwards went on a pilgrimage to Rome where he had a mystical vision of Jesus. He returned to Assisi and lived the life of a beggar. Later he heard a sermon that inspired him to renounce worldly possessions. For the rest of his life, he devoted himself to following the teachings of Jesus in a particularly rigorous way and preaching repentance. His message made a deep impression on people and he attracted followers by his teachings and simple way of life. His ideas were radical at the time because the contemporary church was very rich. Eventually the new community was given permission by the Pope to form a new religious order, the Franciscans. For them prayer, service, personal and group poverty were the essentials to a life devoted to Christ.

Francis’ ideas may not seem very attractive today to those of us who live in nice houses with plenty to eat. Through his commitment to the teachings of Jesus, St Francis of Assisi came to be at peace with God and all creation. His life and example should make us think about our lives and attitudes, and encourage us to behave responsibly towards all of God’s creatures.

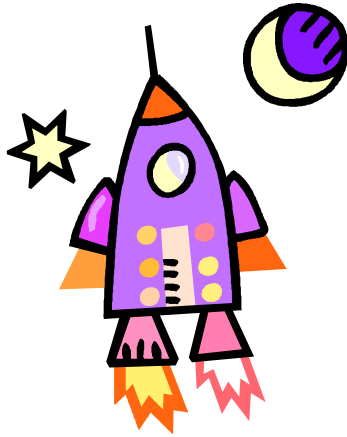

Food and rest for our souls is something we often fail to consider in our busy lives, yet the needs of our soul, deeply embedded in each one us, continues to demand our attention. There is much richness to be found in life if we aim to respect the wholeness of our humanity, both body and soul.

The Parish Council have applied to Surrey County Council's Community Infrastructure Fund for further funding and we will hear in the autumn if we were successful with that. Surrey County Councillor Alan Young has donated from his allowance, funds for a table tennis table and we hope to make a start on setting this up after the summer.

The Parish Council is trying to collate comments to feed back to Surrey County Councils cycle Forum which has been set up to regulate Cycle events in the Surrey Hills Area.

The E-Bulletin organised by the Parish Council has proved very useful in sending out information to parishioners regarding cycling events. The Bulletin is designed to give local people news on local events and if you would like your e-mail added to the list of recipients please contact the clerk.

The Parish Council were very excited to receive a thank you on behalf of the community for the Coronation Jubilee Card which was sent to the Queen. This letter is to be displayed in the Village Hall alongside the Jubilee Panel which was sent as a photograph on the Jubilee card.

The Leap Clear Out day was a great success not only in raising funds for the new playground but also in number of attendees and swaps of items made. The Parish Council would like to express thanks to the LEAP volunteers who work hard to put on this event for the community.

Councillor Chris Lyth and LEAP have jointly assisted Surrey County Council with the setting up of a Rights Of Way Volunteers group for Ewhurst and Ellen's Green. The Volunteers are trained by Surrey County Council who also supply the necessary equipment for work to tidy up and cut back along the numerous footpaths in the area. Very many thanks from the Parish Council for all those who have given up their time to this task.

The Parish Clerk met in July with a representative from Thames Water. They visited every leak that was currently showing itself around the village and these leaks were listed report or action from Thames Water. Please continue to report Water Leaks to Thames Water via their web site including the postcode of the area if at all possible. If the leak persists with no action please then contact the Clerk who now has a contact for such an eventuality.

You will shortly receive from the Parish Council Housing Needs Survey. The Parish Council are asking that you complete this simple survey and return it by no later than the end of October. Given the high cost of buying and renting on the open market in the village, Ewhurst Parish Council would like to know if there is still a need in Ewhurst and Ellen's Green for affordable housing. Local Needs Housing provides a home that can be rented or part-bought; the rent charged is less than the cost on the open market. Local people in housing need might be young people trying to get onto the housing ladder, couples living with parents unable to access the property market, families with young children that need more space or older people who need to downsize. We look forward to hearing from you via the survey.

April and May are a busy time for the Parish Clerk who is also the Responsible Financial Officer for the Council. It is the time of the annual internal audit of financial and administrative processes within the Parish Council as well as the production of the Parish Council Accounts. The annual accounts for 2012-2013 have been signed off by BDO external auditors; they can be viewed on the website www.ewhurst.org.

The precept, the amount of Council Tax requested by the Parish Council (PC) is due to be submitted to Waverley Borough Council at the end of December as always the PC is keen for anyone in the parish to offer suggestions or ideas of improvements for the Ewhurst and Ellen's Green. In Our Midst ~ Molly Cadd
A Real Ewhurst Lady

Molly will tell you that she is a true Ewhurst person, born and bred. One of the originals. Unfortunately for most of us, if you have come to the village since the war you are but a new-comer!



She was born at Hazelbank Cottages in 1923, the only child of Mr & Mrs Coldman and a descendant Caleb Coldman, the last miller to work Ewhurst wind-mill. When she was two years old, her father and his brother Ted built a pair of semi-detached cottages in the Street and the family moved into one with Uncle Ted living in the other next door. Her father took over the running of the family garage on the Bulls Head Green next to the Crown Inn and Ted had a boot making business in the yard at the back. The garage, now a private house, had been started by her grandfather, Henry Coldman and he ran a taxi service and also kept horses in the fields where The Glebe is now. After changes of ownership over the years, many will remember it most recently as Bennett's Garage. Considering how few cars were around at the time, Molly remembers that there were four garages in Ewhurst. They sold petrol at 1/5d a gallon (7p). Lazzel's garage, with the family living above, was on the corner of a footpath, now called Downhurst Road. Jo Edwards' garage was on the site of the present Station Garage and the fourth was a large shed like structure where Lazzel's local buses were garaged and maintained.

Molly's mother, Alice Jones, had come from Wales to work as a nurse at the Cranleigh Rectory and it was through the taxi service that she met her father Fredrick. It was quite a strict upbringing she says and she still remembers being taken to the Evangelical Chapel down the road where she goes to the Baptist Church to this day. Every day she would ride her bike to Miss Wells' school, a private establishment, run at her home at Hazelbank Cottages. Miss Wells was also the church organist and taught music as well. In those days you could buy most things you needed from the shops in the village but for bigger items you caught the bus to Cranleigh. The train to Guildford from Cranleigh was too expensive for ordinary people to consider.

Molly's Father died in 1937 when she was still young and her mother decided to sell the garage business and move to Minehead to live with her sister who ran a boarding house. So it was that Molly spent the war years and finished her schooling there. Minehead itself escaped the bombing but she clearly remembers watching bombs falling on Swansea across the Bristol Channel. She took her first job as a qualified short-hand typist at the Council Offices in Watchett and very much enjoyed working there. However, after the war Molly's mother decided to return to her house which she had kept on in Ewhurst and they were both pleased to return although it meant having to leave everything and everyone whom she had got to know.

Back in Ewhurst she worked as secretary to a London businessman at his home in Shalford, travelling there by bus everyday from home. Her mother worked as a dinner assistant at the village school. Through her aunt, she had also met Ernest, known to everyone as Bill and they married in 1948. He had been in the R.A.F. and worked locally as a carpenter. With no family of her own, Molly continued to work for her boss until his death in the 1980s when she finally retired. She has never owned a passport but with Bill she enjoyed holidays in Scotland, Wales and Channel Islands. For many years, like her father before her, she sang in the Parish Church choir but after a fall a few years ago she now finds it easier to walk to the Baptist Church where she very much enjoys the company and friendship.

Molly is visited at home by Della, her hairdresser and, twice a week, by Sharon her home help, who has been coming to her from Cranleigh for nearly ten years. "We get on very well together" she says and she particularly looks forward to being taken for breakfast at Tiffins before the weekly shopping. She feels well looked after as they do so much extra to help her. The Wednesday coffee mornings and the Monday Club meetings at the Glebe Centre are rarely missed and she is always happy to chat about life in the old days. A sentiment shared by her mother who said she had named the house "Echoes" to recall all the memories of the past. A good name.

LOCAL HISTORY CORNER by Janet Balchin

Cycling

Cyclists are a common sight on local roads at the weekends, and the sport of cycling has its roots in Surrey. In the 1870s Ripley became known as the 'Mecca of cyclists' when hundreds of cyclists would ride down the Portsmouth Road. The Anchor Inn became a favourite place to take refreshment and the inn's visitor's book records over 7,000 names. However, these were the old fashioned high wheeled bikes, also called 'penny farthings'. It was the invention of the safety cycle that brought cycling to the masses. By the 1890s the cost of a cycle came within reach of ordinary people and cycling became hugely popular. Dorking Cycling Club was formed in 1887 and by 1892 it had 100 members.



Many women also took up cycling, but it was difficult to ride a bike in long skirts. The knickerbockers suits promoted by the Rational Dress Society were controversial. In 1898 Richard Cook of the White Horse in Dorking wrote to the Daily Mail that he would not admit women to his coffee room in that disgusting dress called 'rationals' and in 1899 the Viscountess Harberton, a suffragette and co-founder of the Rational Dress Society was refused luncheon in the coffee-room at the Hautboy Hotel in Ockham.

As well as the organised club outings, cycling also provided a popular escape to the countryside for individual riders. The graphic artist Frank Patterson, who lived in Billingshurst, produced numerous illustrations for Cycling Magazine. His line drawings, which include several featuring Ewhurst and Ewhurst Green, perfectly capture the English countryside in the early 20th century.

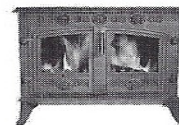

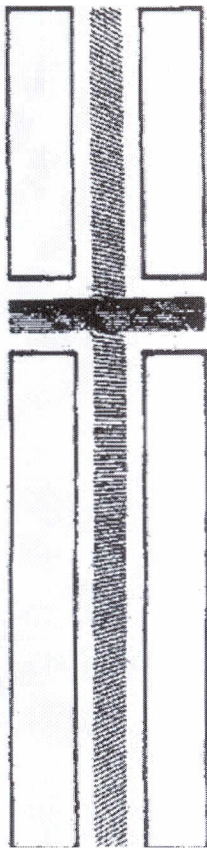
