ST PETER AND ST PAUL'S CHURCH



A NEW BEGINNING

As I write this, it is Ascension Day and I'm reminded of the disciples who have just seen their leader and inspiration go into heaven. Even though they had been told what would happen, they would have been feeling a great sense of loss and wondering what to do next. After all, this was the second time Jesus had been taken away from them. The first was at his crucifixion and now at his ascension into heaven. After the first time, he had miraculously returned to them, but this time it was to be different. There was no going back. They were on their own.

Here in Ewhurst – and indeed in Okewood and Forest Green – we have lost our spiritual leader in the parish quite a number of times; for me this is the fifth time I have known a vacancy between Rectors. On each occasion, the initial thoughts are 'how do we cope?' We are now on our own without a leader. But cope we do. During each vacancy, the church continues its work and its worship due to the commitment of a great number of people. I, with others, may have the privilege of leading services and preaching, but that is not possible without all the background and unseen work that goes on.

I cannot possibly compare ourselves to the disciples, but our situations are similar. The disciples found themselves with instructions from Jesus to go out and tell the world about God, about Jesus, about the Holy Spirit. I am sure that they felt inadequate but we see now how successful they were. Here are we, 2000 years later in a land some 2000 miles from where they were at that time, worshipping just as Jesus commanded. That instruction from Jesus to go out and spread the Word of God applies to us just as much as it did to the disciples – even when we do not have a Rector to lead us. Each time a Rector leaves, our pattern of services and our pastoral care continues. We can all feel inadequate at times, but with the help of God the work of the church goes on. The last 16 months have shown that to be the case. We have gone through a period of major change in our parish, we have successfully brought together three churches with different traditions, we have continued our worship in all three

churches and, with God's guidance, we hope to appoint a new Rector over the next few weeks. We cannot pretend that the process has always been easy and at times we have felt frustrated, but determination and prayer have triumphed.

By the time you read this, the name of the new Rector may be known. Whoever he or she may be, we look forward to a new start in our parish life. We look forward to continuing our work of being disciples for our own time and in our own parish and, most of all, we look forward to working with a new Rector in taking forward our ministry. Indeed, we look forward to a new beginning.

Roof Repair Project Update

Thank you to everyone who has supported our “Save a Slab” campaign. You have donated over £4960 so far which will help to meet the shortfall of costs for the first part of the work to be done on the Chancel. The Quizzers also did well, those at the Bulls Head raised £610 and at the Charity Quiz, £600 – all that brain power put to good use!

The Golf Day and Dinner Dance were not as well supported as we hoped but still raised over £2,000 and was very much enjoyed by all who came. Congratulations to the golf team from the Bulls Head, Andy Hutson, John O’Brien, Barry Jones and Frank Gray on becoming the Team Champions. Many thanks to Clive Ward and Jackie May who organised the events.

We hope you will support our Gift Day in June as this will also support the work on the church roof. *See details on the enclosed leaflet and in the advert in this magazine.*

Most of the surveys on the church are now complete, although you will see on the church calendar that we have bat surveys taking place in May and June. Please be aware of these dates and, if possible, avoid the church surrounds then. During the surveys, the stonemasons noted that the SE and SW buttresses to the Bell Tower were in a dangerous state and immediate repair work was done to stabilise them. Luckily, this was completed before Easter, so services were not disrupted.

Our architect is now busy putting together the specifications for all the work to be done which, after approval by the PCC, have to be sent to Guildford Diocese, Heritage Lottery Fund and Historic England for final approval. However, during this waiting period, tenders can be obtained from specialist firms for work and supplying materials. Martin Lockwood has kindly offered to advise on CDM matters.

Hopefully, approval by all the organisations will be gained before July, so that the application to HLF to release funds for the actual building work can be submitted before the deadline in September, allowing initial building work to start as soon as possible in the autumn.

EwCare is a good neighbour scheme which provides support to people (any age) in the Ewhurst and Ellens Green community. It was set up in October 1998 and continues to provide a valuable service for the community. We are happy to be celebrating our 20th anniversary this year!

Our aim is to put people who are in need of non-specialist help in touch with someone who can provide that help. That could be anything from transport for a surgery/hospital appointment, shopping, collecting a prescription, light gardening, walking your dog or just visiting for a chat. All our helpers volunteer their time and services free because they want Ewhurst and Ellens Green villages to continue their reputation as a caring community.

Requests for help are made by telephoning the Duty Officer between 10am and 12 noon Monday to Friday on 01483 277606 .

They will have details of what each volunteer is able to do and also of their availability, and match the request for help with the most appropriate volunteer. There are only two things we ask, that you ring strictly only between 10am and 12 noon and try and give us as much notice as possible.

Once the arrangement has been finalised and the required information completed, the volunteer carries out the request and collects a voluntary donation to cover basic expenses. So please don't forget to call **EWCARE** on **01483 277606** and talk to the Duty Officer for neighbourly help that is available for anyone in need in our community.

We are always looking to increase the number of volunteers to help in particular with transport to the Royal Surrey County Hospital. Volunteers only give their time when it is convenient to them, there is no regular timetable and because we have so many volunteers there is the option to say no when asked as you will know someone else will be available.

EwCare provides a parking permit for the hospital and we can cover the cost of your fuel. If you can spare some of your time please get in touch with Nicky on 01483 275768 or Angie 01483 277505

By volunteering for EwCare it encourages people in the village to get to know each other. We hold a Tea Party every year as a way of saying thank you to all our volunteers and a sociable AGM.

Traidcraft is NOT the same as Fair Trade goods that are sold in the supermarkets. These Fair Trade goods only help large scale producers, not the small and most vulnerable farmers and traders. Since Fair Trade goods have been available in supermarkets, the income from Traidcraft sales has declined as people do not realise the difference. This means the most vulnerable workers are suffering.

Traidcraft runs projects developing people's potential to trade their way out of poverty in their own countries. Traidcraft also lobbies big business and government for fundamental changes to the way trade works so that it benefits the poor. Traidcraft believe that this is the "Best of Fair".

More news from Kondanani Children's Village

What an amazing May bank holiday weekend we've just had! Three consecutive days of glorious sunshine is almost unheard of! In Malawi there's a public holiday in early May too. Labour Day is celebrated on the first of May and there is usually sunshine, and it's relatively warm (despite being it being winter) but for some, it's not always an occasion to celebrate.

Last year around this time, a lady I had met on several occasions on previous visits to Malawi, went into labour with her sixth child. Her husband had recently abandoned the family, and she was now the sole carer and provider for her five children. She had taken in a lodger to help pay the bills, but times were very hard.

The staff at the clinic where she went for her antenatal check-ups had warned her that this was a big baby and that she would need a C-section for a safe birth. The first pains started in the small hours of the morning. The lodger was dispatched to get a taxi (a bicycle taxi that is) to take the soon to be mother to the clinic about an hour's walk away. No taxi could be found for quite some time and when eventually one did arrive, the long, painful ride over muddy, potholed roads was almost unbearable.

When they eventually arrived at the small local clinic, the sun was almost up and the baby was coming too fast for an ambulance to make it to the bigger hospital with the right equipment for the birth. Things didn't go well during the complicated delivery and only the mother survived.



When I think back on some of the experiences from my time in this small African country, I'm incredibly grateful and very excited to be able to invest back into a community where the needs are so great. I know the paediatric hospital we're setting up at Kondanani Children's Village won't be a maternity unit, but it will be able to help save and improve lives of the

beautiful children I have grown to love.

The hospital buildings have been completed and we are now working on raising funds for equipment to run the facility. If you are interested in finding out more about the project, I'd be happy to answer any question you might have. The Black Bumble Bee Mystery.



Eager for a hint of Spring in mid March I looked at the flowering Pulmonaria with its pink and blue flowers and a little later on at the yellow flowers of the purple Berberis Thunbergii. I was intrigued to find four or five totally black bees with bright orange pollen sacks and very long proboscis, buzzing around diligently even on this cold dull day.

In preparation for the forthcoming annual Friends of the Earth 'Great British Bee Count' in July, I tried to identify it. I found a similar identification photo on Google of a "rare black bee".

In the same week I heard on the radio that at Aston Pottery in Oxfordshire about one hundred rare black *Bombus Ruderatus* Bumble bees had been rediscovered. In the last forty years apparently this species of bee has declined by 70%. I read recently that they are now being produced commercially. Having observed these bees carefully I would think that they would be excellent pollinators as they work hard even on dull days almost from dawn to dusk. Could they really be "rare" bumble bees or does anyone locally have a hive of black bees? If anyone can throw a light on this mystery I would be delighted to hear from you please, at email ewhurstbee@gmail.com.

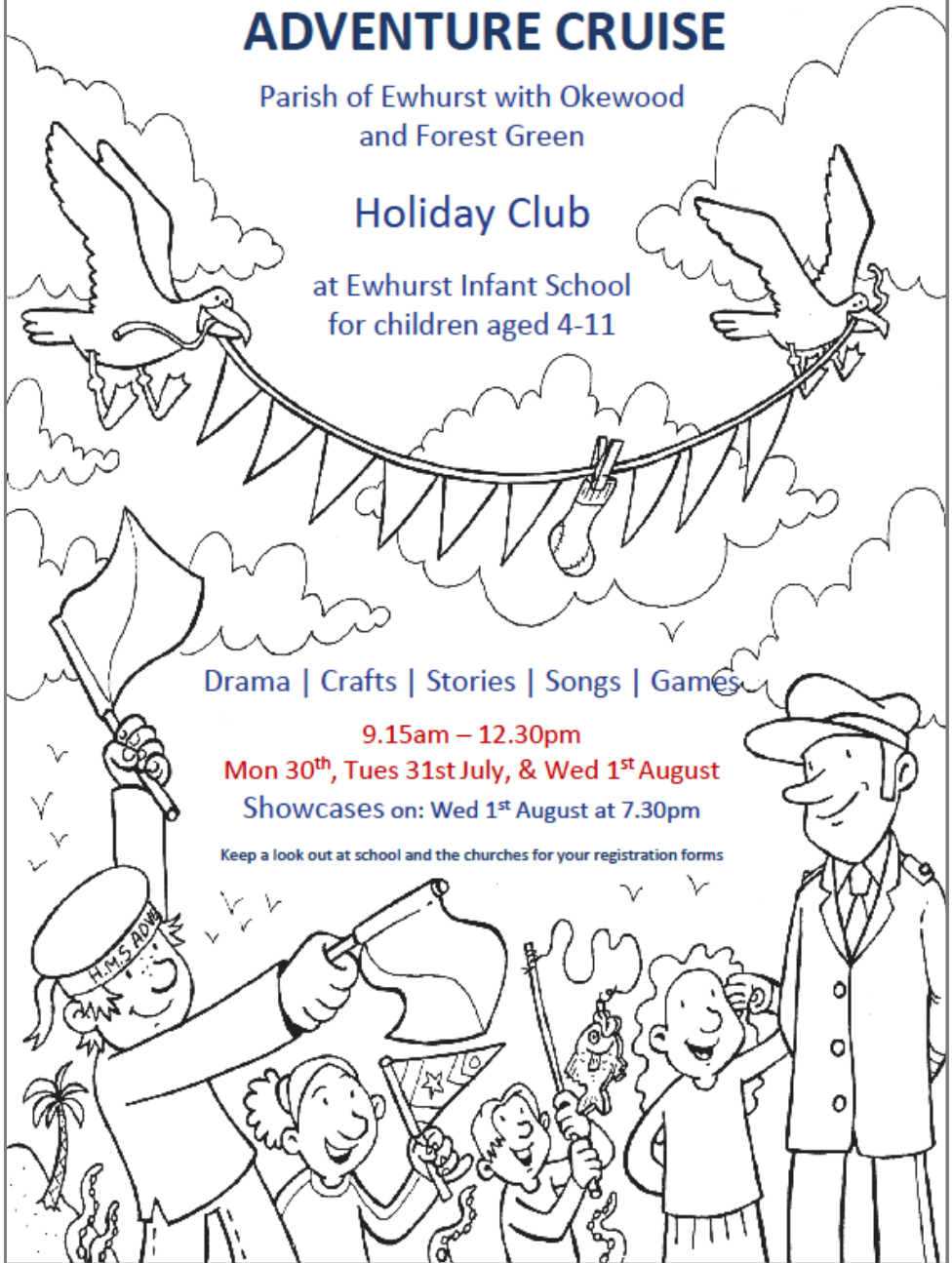

LOCAL HISTORY CORNER, by Janet Balchin

Ewhurst People - Marguerita Fowler - VAD, Girl Guider and Missionary

Marguerita Fowler was born in 1884, the daughter of Letitia Fowler and the late Canon Fowler, of Spange Hawe, Ewhurst. Canon Fowler had died in 1892 and Marguerita and her mother and sister, Maude, moved to Ewhurst around 1906. In 1909 Maude was married at Ewhurst to Harold W. Hodges, a master at the Royal Naval College at Dartmouth. Marguerita never married but devoted her life to helping others.

The Girl Guide movement was established in 1909 as a response to the large number of girls wishing to join the newly-established Boy Scouts. It is not known when Guiding started in Ewhurst, but in the early years of the First World War Marguerita was the Captain of the Ewhurst Girl Guides, who were active in supporting various war efforts on the home front.

In 1915 she joined the Red Cross and trained as a V.A.D. (Voluntary Aid Detachment) nurse. She worked part-time at Oaklands Auxiliary Hospital in Cranleigh from January 1916 until October 1917 and then, for a while, at Torquay Hospital. From June 1918 she worked full time at the Essex County Hospital, before returning to Surrey to work at Thorncombe Military Hospital near Bramley and Henley Park Military Hospital, near Guildford.

Her mother died in 1924 and in 1926 Marguerita trained as a missionary and went to live in an isolated part of Canada as a 'Bishop's Messenger' (similar to a 'lay reader'), where she established a community centre at 'St Faiths' in Swan River, Northern Manitoba. Her 'parish' covered 400 square miles, extending as far north as Hudson's Bay. It was a remote and sparsely populated area and Marguerita and her helpers worked tirelessly to support both white settlers and the local native people.

She founded the first company of Girl Guides at Swan River and eventually became Division Commissioner for Guides and Brownies for Northern Manitoba. Because of the vast distances between settlements she established a 'Lone Guide' programme, which allowed a single girl to become a member and keep in touch by post.

She was appointed O.B.E. in 1931 for her work at St Faiths and in 1942 was presented with a Medal of Merit for her services to girl guiding in Manitoba. It was noted that Guide membership had grown from 31 in 1929 to 520 in 1942 and the Lone Guide programme was particularly successful.

She kept in touch with Ewhurst, writing regular letters for the Parish Magazine and visiting on occasions when she returned to England. She died in 1970 and her ashes were interred on her mother's grave in Ewhurst churchyard - Letitia Fowler's grave is marked by a stone cross on the west side of the path near the gate from the churchyard to the Old Rectory Drive.

In 1973 a plaque was placed in her memory in Brandon Cathedral, Manitoba, "in honour of a great pioneer lady, whose vision and fervent dedication to a calling has furnished the people of Swan River and surrounding areas with a unique experience in courage, Christian love and charity". It reads "To the Glory of God/ and in memory of Marguerita D. Fowler O.B.E./ Founder of Bishops Messengers of St Faith's 1928/ Born 1884 – Died 1970"

In Our Midst - Anne Barrett-Lennard

An inspirational interest in so many things

The enthusiasm and interest which Anne has in so many things must surely have inspired the many young people whom she taught during her career in education. Now in retirement with husband John, she has for many years, taken an active part in many aspects of village life.



Her parents moved to Guildford from London soon after the first war and it was here that she was born, a full eleven years after her two sisters and two brothers.

In fact, while she was at school during the second war, they were already actively involved with wartime jobs, one sister nursing in London, the other supervising the telegram office in Guildford which could be a very harrowing job. Her older brother was a navigator in a Wellington bomber and the other had elected to serve in submarines. She had a lovely childhood, she says. There was always something going on with the neighbours and her young friends around her home just off Woodbridge Hill. They had a big garden, both her parents gardened and with an allotment, they were pretty self-sufficient.

Anne's lifelong interest in wild flowers began with her Mother and together they would regularly take long walks to find and study them. She particularly remembers walking along the Pilgrim's Way from Pewley Hill to St Martha's Church and from the Watts Gallery across the golf course to Puttenham. With chalk downs, heathland, clay and rivers all nearby, there was so much to find in the different habitats. No surprise then that her family regularly won the wild flower display at the Guilford Show. Music is another great interest. Starting young and helped by her father who played the banjo, she learned to play the xylophone at home and gave performances at school. At eight she conducted the school percussion band and started piano lessons which she continued for many years into the senior school. She loved to attend the concerts held at the Odeon Cinema and sometimes in the Technical College Hall. The Guildford Philharmonic was led by the well-known conductor J Crossley Clithero and of the visiting celebrities, the wonderful violinist Ida Haendel was particularly memorable in her flowing red dress. Now they go to events at G Live.

At 10 years old Anne passed the eleven plus exam to go to the County Grammar

School. This meant that at 15 she should have been in the first year to take the new O Level exams but the rules did not allow this. A very unsatisfactory situation. She was always interested in the academic subjects and at A-level took French, Latin and Maths. By this time she had young nephews who lived locally and she found that she very much enjoyed looking after and working with them. This was probably the reason why she decided against going to university and to wait a year before applying for primary teacher training. In this gap year she learnt a lot about life, taking a few jobs and travelling in Scotland. After that she had a very enjoyable time at Bishop Otter College in Chichester from where she was able to enjoy the countryside, cycle to the coast and explore all around - the harbour, Dell Quay, Bosham, Fishbourne.

Her father died while she was at college and after qualifying her first thought was to go home and teach locally. Later, a move to a new school at Kiddington, Oxfordshire was both rewarding and enlightening as the county was educationally streets ahead with a very foresighted education officer. A move to join a friend at a school on the outskirts of Reading was a totally different experience. Badly run and in a difficult area, the head could not keep her staff and although she stayed only a short time, when she left, Anne was the longest serving member of staff. However, she considers herself fortunate to have had such a wide experience in such different situations.

In the 1960s, French was introduced into primary schools and she opted to learn to teach the language. Six months of intensive conversation sessions in the George Abbott School language laboratory were followed by a final three months in Paris. What a wonderful experience. With a friend, she would walk from their hotel each day to the course at the Institut Britannique de la Sorbonne and at weekends explore places further away such as the homes of Renoir and Van Gogh. On her return she not only taught the subject but was responsible for introducing it into other schools in the authority.

Anne gained her first headship at Sandfield School in Stoke Road, Guildford. She was there for five years and loved every minute of it. Although it was a crowded, limited site on both sides of the road, the staff were wonderful and the parents very supportive. The Ugandan Crisis at that time meant they received several Asian families into the school. Some were very deprived and it was marvellous to see how they blossomed with better food and living conditions. Anne will never forget one social occasion when a Sikh family in their traditional dress complete with turbans did English barn dances across the school hall. Later, the

son from that family passed his 11+ on the strength of his description of his first ride on an elephant when visiting relations in India. Not what you expect in deepest Surrey.

With reorganisation in 1976, Sandfield was due to become a first school and Anne moved to become head at Bushy Hill, Merrow, one of the newly created middle schools. Nothing had been done to prepare for the new school and the first six month period was exhausting, non-stop work. A school with a wide catchment area including Clandon and Burpham, Bushy Hill was a huge challenge and never easy but it had a groundswell of support which made it very rewarding. Before the National Curriculum tightly defined what had to be taught, it was very satisfying as a head to allow her staff to work to their own strengths and develop their own ways of doing things. Pupils benefitted hugely from this flexible approach and job satisfaction was enormous. It was hard work but never dull.

Anne met John while she was on holiday with a friend and he was walking with a group from Harrow, his home town. They were quite different she says but their shared interests brought them together and they stayed in touch. After other walking holidays taken together, they were married in 1984 and moved to Ewhurst in 1994. The bungalow in the Cranleigh Road has a perfectly shaped garden and is within the sound of the church bells, a priority for John. Now they were able to immerse themselves in the things they enjoyed. A flower arranging course at Merrist Wood College was like a breath of fresh air and there were wonderful walking holidays both at home and abroad, to study and photograph the wild flowers and architecture. Using John's beautiful photographs, they have given over two hundred and fifty talks about the places they have visited and what they saw in both town and countryside.

Their beautiful garden was created and Anne was a committee member of both Ewhurst Horticultural and History societies. As church warden at St Peter & St Paul she worked with Colin Stewart and particularly remembers the hard work done during the vacancy before David Minns came. They made a good team, like the Charities Group who she still works with today.

In fact it is being part of a team with everything she has done in life which Anne says has given the most satisfaction.

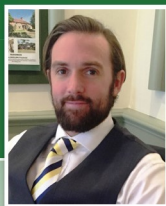
